Thank you for contributing an article to the *Wisconsin Lawyer* magazine. The State Bar of Wisconsin (the State Bar), a nonprofit organization and official publisher of the *Wisconsin Lawyer* magazine, gratefully acknowledges your volunteer contribution of time and expertise. This Agreement sets forth the rights and responsibilities of the State Bar and the Author concerning the publication of the Article.

If this Agreement reflects the understanding between you and the State Bar, please sign both of the copies of this Agreement in the spaces provided below. This Agreement must be completed and submitted to the State Bar prior to approval for publication. The second copy is for your records.

1. Grant of Rights

The Author grants to the State Bar a perpetual nonexclusive license:

- (a) To edit, print, publish and distribute the Article in the *Wisconsin Lawyer* magazine. The State Bar will give the Author an opportunity to review the Article prior to publication, but the State Bar will make final editorial and administrative decisions;
- (b) To adapt or make derivative works of the Article, or any portion of it, as part of any product or publication of the State Bar. The Article as published in *Wisconsin Lawyer*, together with any adaptation or derivative work based on the Article created as part of a product or publication of the State Bar shall be referred to in this Agreement as the State Bar Versions of the Article.

- (c) To reproduce, distribute, publish, display, and perform State Bar Versions of the Article in any medium now known or hereafter developed, including but not limited to CD-ROM, the Internet or any electronic, magnetic, or optical medium;
- (d) To authorize third parties to reproduce, distribute or provide access to the State Bar Versions of Article.

2. Publicity Rights

The Author grants to the State Bar, and to any third party authorized by the State Bar, the right to use your name, biographical information and likeness in connection with the promotion, publication, display, performance, or distribution of the State Bar Versions of the Article in any medium.

3. Publication

The State Bar reserves the right to decline to publish all or part of the Article in the *Wisconsin Lawyer* if, in the State Bar's discretion, publication of the Article will not meet the *Wisconsin Lawyer's* publishing objectives. If the Article has not been published in the *Wisconsin Lawyer* within twelve months of the delivery of the Article to the State Bar, this Agreement will automatically terminate and all rights granted to the State Bar in this Agreement will end.

4. Warranties and Indemnification

The Author represents and warrants that:

- (a) The Author is the original and sole creator of the Article and all of its parts, including all illustrations, photographs, and other material incorporated into the Article, except for those portions of the Article that the Author has identified as created by a third party. If the Article contains copyrighted material owned by a third party, the Author agrees to obtain the written permission from the copyright owner and to include the written permission with the Article submitted to the State Bar.
- (b) The Article does not libel anyone, infringe upon any copyright, other proprietary right, privacy right, or any other right of any other person.
- (c) The Author has the authority to enter into this Agreement and to grant the rights given in this Agreement. The Author warrants that if the Article has been published anywhere in any medium prior to its publication in the *Wisconsin Lawyer*, the Author has provided the full details of all such publications in writing to the State Bar prior to signing this Agreement.

The Author will indemnify, defend, and hold harmless the State Bar, its officers, employees and licensees against any loss, cost, or expense arising in any way from the Author's breach of any of the warranties made in this Agreement.

5. Consideration and Copyright Ownership

The Author grants the rights given in this Agreement in consideration of the State Bar's publication of the Article in the *Wisconsin Lawyer*. The State Bar will identify the Author in all State Bar Versions of the Article. The State Bar will ordinarily provide ten complementary copies of the issue in which the Article appears, although the number of complementary copies may be reduced if sufficient copies are not available in inventory. The Author will retain ownership of the copyright to the Article, subject to the rights granted in this Agreement.

6. Author's Republication of the Article

The Author may not republish the Article in another publication, other than a State Bar publication, for thirty days after the mailing of the *Wisconsin Lawyer* issue in which the article appears. After thirty days, the Author may republish the Article with the consent of the State Bar. Consent to republication will not be unreasonably withheld, provided that the State Bar receives a written request for republication explaining the circumstances of the republication at least thirty days prior to the proposed republication. The foregoing restrictions apply only to republication in another publication, and do not apply to the independent reproduction and distribution of copies of the Article by the Author.

The Author shall ensure that any reprint, reproduction, or republication of the Article in any form in any medium, will include a statement in the following form: "Reprinted with permission from the (month/year) *Wisconsin Lawyer*, the official publication of the State Bar of Wisconsin." If the Article is adapted, modified, or changed in any respect for republication, the statement required by this section shall also indicate the Article has been modified since its original publication in the *Wisconsin Lawyer*. The Author's right to reprint, reproduce, or republish the Article is limited to the material submitted by the Author to the State Bar, and does not include any photography or graphics contributed by the State Bar.

7. Entire Agreement

This Agreement constitutes the whole Agreement between the Author and the State Bar and may be modified only in writing, and only if signed by both parties.

The State Bar has chosen this Article on the basis of the Author's personal knowledge, experience and professional reputation; the Author's rights and obligations are therefore not transferable, even within your firm or organization, without the State Bar's written approval.

Supplemental Agreement for Employers Who Claim Copyright
