WHEREAS; Healthcare Decisions Day is designed to engage the public in advance care planning, a process of understanding, reflecting on, and discussing future medical decisions, including end-of-life medical care preferences; and

WHEREAS; Wisconsin citizens are encouraged to have in-depth conversations with their loved ones about their health care values and wishes, to document their preferences in a written advance directive, and to ensure the advance directive is filed in their medical record; and

WHEREAS; it is estimated that only 20 percent of Wisconsin citizens and less than 50 percent of severely or terminally ill patients have an advance directive, likely because of the need for knowledge, support and unified systems, and policies; and

WHEREAS; Healthcare Decisions Day serves to encourage citizens and health care facilities to participate in a statewide effort to create systems, policies, and workflows that ensure advance care planning is a standard of patient care; and

WHEREAS; the State Bar of Wisconsin, the Wisconsin Medical Society, and numerous other organizations throughout Wisconsin are endorsing this event, and are committed to engaging the public in the advance care planning process, and increasing the number of Wisconsinites with advance directives;

NOW, THEREFORE, I, Scott Walker, Governor of the State of Wisconsin, do hereby proclaim Thursday, April 16, 2015, as

HEALTHCARE DECISIONS DAY

throughout the State of Wisconsin, and I commend this observance to all of our citizens.
