State Bar of Wisconsin, Greater Wisconsin Initiative Bus Tour	To offset program expenses for the Third Annual State Bar of Wisconsin Greater Wisconsin Initiative Bus Tour held on October 5-6, 2018, in the Tri-County area (Pepin, Buffalo, Trempeleau, and Jackson) and the Crawford/Grant counties area.	\$2,100
State Bar of Wisconsin High School Mock Trial Tournament	Familiarizes students with the American legal system with students participating in a trial simulation as lawyers and witnesses.	\$11,000
Wisconsin Justice Initiative	For their municipal court project to reduce the number of jail commitments for unpaid municipal-court fines and educating indigent municipal-court defendants to avoid such incarceration.	\$1,650
