Remedial Action Since Incident

Prior to July 1, 2009, there were two kinds of OAR: OAR 1st was noncriminal and subsequent offenses were criminal. As of July 1, 2009, there are two kinds of OAR based on the reason for the <u>underlying revocation</u>: §343.44(2)(as) provides that if the revocation was not alcohol or drug related the penalty is a forfeiture (TR); §343.44(2)(b) provides that if the revocation was alcohol or drug related there is a criminal penalty (CT, CM). §343.307(2) defines which offenses are alcohol and drug related.
