Barron County Task Force	This project gained national prominence as a model for restorative justice programs. The grant provided some start-up moneys in the 2000 and 2001 fiscal years that got this program off the ground. The program helped Barron County face some serious issues facing their community with regard to juvenile delinquency, crime and victimization. Eventually became known nationwide as the Barron County Restorative Justice Program, Inc.	\$3,000
Community Adolescent Program (CAP)	CAP is a private, non-profit organization providing a variety of services to delinquent and at-risk youth, their families, victims, and the juvenile justice system. This grant was directed toward Victim Offender Counseling (VOC).	\$3,000
Dane County Bar Association Juvenile Justice Video	Grant funded a video presentation that depicted the juvenile justice process. The video informed children, adolescents and their teachers about the provisions of the Juvenile Code and the Juvenile Justice Process.	\$5,000
