State Bar of Wisconsin Law-related Education	<p>Dialogues on Democracy:</p> <p>This program is a strong collaboration between five groups to present a democracy education program. Involved in the project are the Wisconsin Educational Communications Board, the Wisconsin Historical Society, the State Bar of Wisconsin Law-related Education Committee, the Wisconsin Supreme Court, and the UW- Madison School of Education. A grant of \$2,500 was provided offset conference costs enabling teachers and citizens to register for the conference at a reduced rate.</p> <p>Educational Publications:</p> <p>Support from last year's grant has continued to support printing of these publications. Included in this year's grant was a Bill of Rights Teacher's Manual for \$1,500.</p> <p>High School Mock Trial Tournament:</p> <p>This year marks the establishment of the designated gift fund for the High School Mock Trial Tournament. The goal of this fund is to reduce the fee for schools participating in the program and assisting in the maintenance of this program far into the future.</p>	\$8,650

	<p>Judicial Teacher Institute:</p> <p>This annual program received funding for social studies teachers to better teach their students about the judicial system in Wisconsin and the role of our Wisconsin Supreme Court. Justices from the Court present their viewpoints on the judicial system. This represents \$4,650 of this year's LRE Grant.</p>	
Wisconsin Supreme Court	This grant represents a large portion of the funding for a new juror orientation videotape in both video and DVD formats to be used in Wisconsin's 72 counties. The video will be viewed by approximately 70,000 jurors throughout the state.	\$13,350
