Bar History Highlights

1878 – Wisconsin Bar is organized

1980 – The State Bar’s Lawyer Referral Program and Lawyer Hotline merged to form the Lawyer Referral and Information Service; as a result, the Bar developed the first-of-its-kind computer program to match callers with attorneys

1980 – Residency requirement for admission to practice in the state is eliminated

State Bar of Wisconsin: is a professional association that provides continuing legal education, networking opportunities, practice management assistance, and other services to its more than 25,000 members. Board of Bar Examiners (BBE): evaluates the skills, character, and fitness of lawyers and also writes and grades the Wisconsin Bar Examination. The Supreme Court requires the BBE to suspend a lawyer’s license if he or she does not comply with continuing legal education requirements. Office of Lawyer Regulation (OLR): is an agency of the Wisconsin Supreme Court. It receives grievances relating to lawyer misconduct, conducts investigations, and prosecutes violations of ethics rules. Visit wicourts.gov/courts/offices/olr.htm.

Wisconsin CLE Requirements

The BBE monitors lawyer compliance with SCR Chapter 31, the rule outlining continuing legal education attendance and reporting requirements for Wisconsin-licensed lawyers.

How many credits do I need?

As a Wisconsin lawyer, you need 30 continuing legal education (CLE) credits every two calendar years. Three of those 30 need to be in approved coursework in the area of legal ethics and professional responsibility (EPR).

Lawyers have the option to earn a maximum of six credits on subjects designed to enhance a lawyer's awareness and understanding (LAU) of substance abuse/dependence disorders, mental illness, stress management, and work/life balance relating to the practice of law.

Lawyers may obtain another six credits on the subject of law practice management (LPM) which may include topics such as client communications, trust accounting, record keeping, applications of technology, and other subjects essential to the practice of law. Courses or portions of courses dealing primarily with profit enhancement or marketing of services will be denied credit [see SCR 31.02].

How do I report?

All attorneys will be required to electronically file their CLE report using the CLE reporting website at clereporting.wicourts.gov/session/new.

It's very important that you keep track of the courses you take (what, when, where, the sponsor's name, and the number of CLE/EPR hours attended).

When do I report?

Your reporting year is determined by your year of admission to practice law in Wisconsin (e.g., if you were admitted in an odd-numbered year, instructions on reporting CLE will be sent by the BBE in the fall of every odd-numbered year).

Keep in mind that the CLE reporting deadline is different from the CLE attendance deadline. Check the BBE website for the correct attendance and reporting dates for your year of admission.

Wisconsin CLE Requirements (continued)

What CLE courses qualify?

The BBE determines which courses qualify to satisfy the CLE/EPR requirements. All CLE seminars that list an amount of CLE credits have either been approved for that credit amount or have credit applications pending before the Board of Bar Examiners.

Never assume courses have been approved for Wisconsin credit. Check the BBE website for a listing of approved CLE courses at wicourts.gov/services/attorney/coursesearch.htm. Attorneys may also earn CLE credit for teaching, publishing legal writing, and pro bono work.

For more on CLE requirements, visit wicourts.gov/services/attorney/cle.htm. Note that noncompliance with the mandatory CLE requirements can result in suspension of your license.

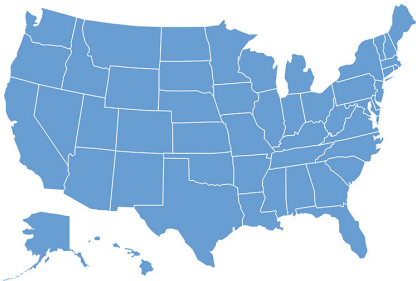
Government Lawyers Division

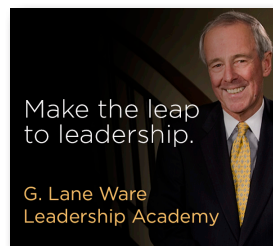

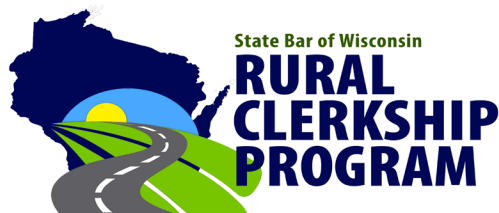
Greater Wisconsin Initiative

The State Bar’s **Greater Wisconsin Initiative** encourages attorneys to consider practicing in Greater Wisconsin. We’re here to help you learn if rural practice is right for you and provide you with the resources you need to get started. Wisconsin’s rural population tops 1.6 million. With many lawyers approaching retirement age, more and more nonurban communities are at risk of losing access to legal services. Why? As attorneys retire, there aren’t always other lawyers around to take their place.

Some areas of Wisconsin are already experiencing the consequences of lawyer shortages. More than 60 percent of Wisconsin lawyers are located in the state’s three urban counties. On the other hand, a number of nonurban counties have fewer than 10 lawyers each. Many more counties have fewer than 20 lawyers.

What happens when a rural area no longer has a lawyer? Vital legal needs go unmet and access to justice is jeopardized. What does this mean for you as a new lawyer? Opportunities abound all over Wisconsin to establish your practice!

Rural Clerkship Program

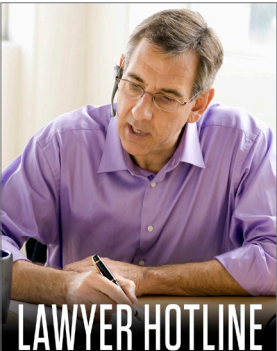
